Highlights of this Half Term

Careers Week

Thank you to all those families who supported us with these projects.

Yesterday, the children were 'scientists' for the day and enjoyed a carousel of practical science activities to support the opening of our Phiz Lab and to test out some of our exciting new science equipment. Special thanks to Mrs Humphrey for her hard work in preparation for setting up the Phiz Lab and for arranging this event.









Year 6 SATs

We are incredibly proud of the maturity, resilience and determination shown by our Year 6 pupils, not just during their recent test week but throughout the whole year. They approached test week with a calm confidence, and all gave their absolute best.

VE Day 80th Anniversary

On May the 8th, our academy community came together to mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day. The children found out about the historical importance of the day, and we also remembered all those who sacrificed so much for our county during the war, including many people who came from our community. It was an honour to be able to share the story of a local member of the Royal Navy and for the children to see his war medals, which were so proudly shared by his great grandson. The assembly hall was a sea of red, white and blue to mark the occasion!







Roman Day

Year 3 had a visit from Titus, a Roman soldier, who told the children all about what it was like to be a Roman. They practised charging at the enemy and recreating actual Roman shield formations, seeing real Roman weapons and marching around with their scutums (shields) just as the army would have done. Back in the classroom, the children learned about Roman coins and then created their own. They enjoyed looking at mysterious historical objects left behind from the Iceni tribe and the Roman army.







Year 1 and Year 5 Visits to the 'Young Out There' Project.

Pupils in Years 1 and 5 had the opportunity to see performances from world-renowned artists and got the chance to ask them questions about their creative careers. This project focuses on quality experiences designed for local young people and provided our pupils with opportunities to meet and collaborate with a diverse range of performers from different artistic disciplines. In addition, the children created their own percussion instruments using sustainable materials. Their musical creations will feature in the 'Beach of Dreams Flag Parade' at the 'Out There' Festival. Their artistic creations were also used to help create Great Yarmouth's bespoke sweatshirt fabric. Using stencils of iconic landmarks, fabric inks, paints and rollers, they designed a tapestry that represents Great Yarmouth.





Tennis Festival



A group of pupils in Year 2 children travelled to Ormiston Venture Academy to participate in the annual Tennis Festival and enjoyed some themed activities run by their pupils. The event aimed to help improve the children's hand-eye co-ordination, agility, aim and ball control as well as being lots of fun!

School Council Community Links

We have been developing community links through our befriending project with a local residential home. This term we have linked our School Council members with residents at the local St Edmunds Residential Home. The children were delighted to receive a reply from their pen friends and were fascinated to learn more about their lives. We look forward to developing links further over the coming months for the benefit of both the children and the residents. One of our pen friends is the oldest lady in Norfolk, at aged 111 years, and the children enjoyed learning about her role in WW2 during our VE Day assembly.

Reception Stay and Play Sessions – Keeping Healthy

The children really enjoy sharing their learning with their families and it was lovely to see so many families joining us.
